# RECYCLING 101

We must answer **YES** to these 2 following questions:

#### QUESTION #1

Is this object made of paper, cardboard, plastic, glass or metal?

#### **QUESTION #2**

Is this object printed matter, wrapping or a container?

- NO: SO, WE DON'T PUT IT IN THE BIN.
- YES: THEN PUT IT IN THE BIN. BUT BEWARE...



IDENTIFY THE CODES IN THE MÖBIUS LOOP (3 ARROWS FORMING A TRIANGLE): 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 OR 7. PLEASE NOTE: ALL PLASTIC #6 ITEMS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE!

#### PLASTIC WRAPPING: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Only plastic wrapping that "stretches" when you try to tear it should go in the bin. For example, plastic bags from sliced bread, plastic wrap from the dry cleaners, or grocery bags, go in the bin. It's even better if you bundle them together in a bag of bags!
- ✓ Plastic wrapping that doesn't "stretch" when you try to tear it must not be put in the bin. For example, bags of frozen fruit, cereal, rice or other foods must not be put in your recycling bin.

#### NON-STRETCHY WRAPPERS

e.g.: moulded and vacuum-packed, for cereal (granola) bars, bags of chips, frozen fruit, cereals, rice, pouches and self-standing bags

PLASTIC AND STYROFOAM (DISPLAYING MÖBIUS LOOP CODE #6)
e.g.: some small yogurt containers, Styrofoam coffee cups
and plates, plastic utensils

LONG AND STRINGY ITEMS

e.g.: electrical extension cords, strings of lights, clotheslines

TEXTILES AND HOUSEHOLD WASTE

e.g.: shoes, soiled diapers, table scraps, bags of leaves, facial tissues, cotton swabs

HHW (HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE)
AND CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS

e.g.: tires, propane tanks, batteries, nails, etc.
